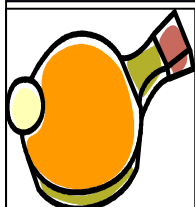

## Three Mills Island Tour and Walk (London Cerrsa)

**Peter Jefferson Smith reports:** On 17 June, 15 members visited Three Mills Island, at Bromley-by-Bow in the East End. It has many associations for the Department.

The Mills were tidal mills on the River Lea, milling grain for gin distilling. The House Mill is the largest of the survivors and we were able to tour it from top to bottom. Members of the Department remember Three Mills from the days when gin distilling had moved elsewhere, and the complex was run by Bass Charrington for bulk warehousing and bottling. The warehouses are now film studios and not



normally accessible to the public. When our party arrived, the area outside the gates was being used for filming a confrontation between the Met and a crowd of rioting Asians, for a Bollywood soap. We were privileged to be escorted through the riots for a walk round the former warehousing area. We were able to point to the tanks used for storage of Bacardi in bulk, and also the sites of the C&E offices – one site in the warehouse compound, one just outside it, in a building labelled as the Custom House. Later, we walked round the island to a memorial commemorating people who had died, including James Ede, Officer HM Excise 29 June 1908. It is thought that he and one of the distillery staff had been killed in an explosion.

The River Lea Tidal Mill Trust welcomes recollections from anyone who worked at Three Mills Island. They have some material from former C&E staff, but would welcome more. COST - £52 per person per night, dinner, bed and breakfast in a standard double room, with a supplement of £3 pppn for rooms with a sea view. The single supplement is £6 per person per night, irrespective of room size. There is an option to stay an extra night on Sunday 8 May or Thursday 12 May at the same rate. This is an old hotel with varying levels; please tell reception when booking if you require a room with direct lift access.

**Martin Spillane reminisces:-** "In 1966 I was a UO in Liverpool 3 Excise, assisting Jack Mulcahy, then an Excise Officer and later Surveyor and AC. He suggested I visit a particular clothing shop, for in the shop window, amongst the suits, shirts and ties, was a tailor's dummy, with a part-made jacket, covered in tacking cotton. This indicated that they were not just selling suits, but were also making them and so could be liable to Purchase Tax registration. Along I went and introduced myself to the owner. My inspection revealed a room at the back, with rolls of suiting and half a dozen sewing machines. The trader obviously knew the score and, when I looked at these, he proclaimed very loudly that he was "only doing repairs."

Unfortunately, he had mislaid his order book and, although we both looked, we failed to find it. Just then, a young man arrived and, on seeing me, asked "What's the problem?" "We can't find the cutting book," I replied. "Oh, it's here," he said, producing it from its hiding place in the base of one of the sewing machines. The trader buried his face in his hands and uttered a heartfelt cry of "With a son like that, who needs a hole in the head!" I then found that he had also been doing out-work for a well known firm of Saville Row tailors. I duly registered him and prepared an assessment for about £4,000, which (at 1960's rates) paid my salary for the next couple of years. 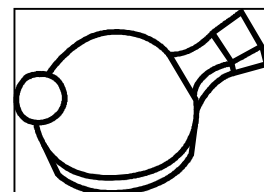
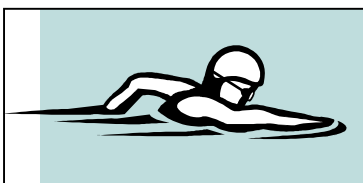
