Dear Sir/Madam,

Your motor vehicle, registration number has been delivered free of Customs charges, subject to strict observance of the conditions which were set out in the form of application and which are reproduced below for convenience:-

- (i) that the vehicle is for your own personal use or that of your dependants; and
- (ii) that it will not be, or be offered to be, lent, hired, pledged, given away, exchanged, sold or otherwise disposed of in the United Kingdom within a period of two years from the date either of its importation or of your arrival in the United Kingdom for a stay of at least twelve months, whichever was the later.

Any breach of any of the conditions will render the vehicle liable to forfeiture under Section 8 of the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) (No. 3) Order 1968.

When the two year period mentioned above has expired, the vehicle may be disposed of without further reference to this Department. You, or the new owner, may apply to the licensing authority with whom the car is registered for a new, unendorsed registration book.

If you wish to enquire about release from the conditions before the end of the two year period, you should write to your local Officer of Customs and Excise, whose address will be found in the local telephone directory. Your enquiry should quote the port or airport and the rotation number shown above.
