I. ISSUE OF ELECTRIC LAMPS TO THE
WATERGUARD SERVICE.

Electric lamps will in future be issued to the Waterguard Service on the following basis:—

- (a) A set of 3 lamps to each rummage crew for general rummage purposes: and
- (b) A lamp for the use of the boarding crew at each port and creek where no rummage crew is stationed, the lamp to be restricted to use in rummaging oil-driven vessels and vessels with explosives or highly inflammable cargoes on board.

Collectors with Customs business and the Waterguard Superintendent, London, are accordingly to forward requisitions to the Superintendent of Stores, 5, Jewry Street, London, E.C. 3, for the supplies necessary to meet the requirements, on the above basis, of the Waterguard Staff under their supervision. On receipt of the electric lamps

the float lamps and ordinary oil lamps displaced from use by the issue of the electric lamps are to be returned forthwith to the Superintendent of Stores.

Dry batteries (refills) for use in the electric lamps should be requisitioned from the Superintendent of Stores, but, owing to their tendency to deteriorate while kept in store, should not be requisitioned much in advance of actual requirements.

These instructions give effect to a decision of the Departmental Whitley Council.
