## GENERAL ORDER.

Collectors and Officers of the Waterguard Service are informed, with reference to Section VII. of the Waterguard Committee's report, that the Treasury, on the recommendation of the Board, have fixed the numbers of the classes mentioned below as follows:—

The apportionment of the above 42 posts of Chief Preventive Officer between the Upper and Lower Sections will be determined hereafter.

The numbers mentioned include an Unattached staff in London for the purpose of officiating during the absence by leave or sickness of fixed Officers throughout the country.

The titles Inspector and Assistant Inspector will apply to members on the Inspector-General's staff, and the title Waterguard Superintendent to members on the local establishments.

Superintendents and Chief Preventive Officers may be required, in addition to their ordinary duties at their own ports, to advise the Collectors of certain other ports under conditions the details of which will be communicated in due course to the Collectors concerned.

The additions to the staff will take effect from the 1st January next, and the Board will proceed to make the necessary promotions forthwith.
