## TRAFFIC WITH IRISH FREE STATE.

As from midnight on 31st March, 1923, the Irish Free State will be a separate area for Customs and Excise purposes.

Traffic between Great Britain and Northern Ireland on the one hand and the Irish Free State on the other, whether by sea or over the land boundary between Northern Ireland and the Free State, will for all purposes be imports and exports subject to the Customs laws and regulations applicable to overseas trade.
