EXTRA REMUNERATION (exceeding 25L.) :—

A considerable number of Preventive Officers, Preventive Men and Launchmen receive extra remuneration in excess of 25L. per annum each for Overtime Pay, Night Pay, and Sunday Pay (see under B. 4).
